Purpose of the policy

The centre is committed to ensuring that the exams management and administration process is run effectively and efficiently and in compliance with the published JCQ regulations and awarding body requirements.

This exam policy will ensure that:

- all aspects of the centre's exam process are documented, supporting the exams contingency plan, and other relevant exams-related policies, procedures and plans are signposted to.
- the workforce is well informed and supported.
- all centre staff involved in the exams process clearly understand their roles and responsibilities.
- all exams and assessments are conducted according to JCQ and awarding body regulations, guidance and instructions, thus always maintaining the integrity and security of the exam/assessment system.
- exam candidates understand the exams process and what is expected of them.

This policy is reviewed annually to ensure ways of working in the centre are accurately reflected and that exams and assessments are conducted to current JCQ (and awarding body) regulations, instructions and guidance.

This policy will be communicated to all relevant centre staff.

This policy will be communicated to all relevant centre via the schools learning Gateway and the school website.

Roles and responsibilities overview

The head of centre is the individual who is accountable to the awarding bodies for ensuring that the centre is compliant with the published JCQ regulations and awarding body requirements in order to ensure the security and integrity of the examinations/assessments at all times.

The examinations officer is the person appointed by the head of centre to act on behalf of, and be the main point of contact for, the centre in matters relating to the general administration of awarding body examinations and assessments.

The head of centre may not appoint themselves as the examinations officer. A head of centre and an examinationsofficer are two distinct and separate roles.[GR 2]

Head of centre

- Understands the contents, refers to and directs relevant centre staff to annually updated JCQ publications including:
 - o <u>General Regulations for Approved Centres</u> (GR)
 - Instructions for Conducting Examinations (ICE)
 - <u>Access Arrangements and Reasonable Adjustments</u> (AA)
 - o <u>Suspected Malpractice in Examinations and Assessments</u> (SMEA)
 - <u>Instructions for conducting non-examination assessments</u> (NEA) (and the instructions for conducting coursework)
 - <u>A guide to the special consideration process</u> (SC)
- Ensures the centre has appropriate accommodation to support the size of the cohorts being taught including appropriate accommodation for candidates requiring access arrangements for exams and assessments.
- Takes responsibility for responding to the National Centre Number Register annual update (administered on behalf of the JCQ member awarding bodies by OCR <u>ocr.org.uk/administration/stage-1-preparation/ncn-annual-update/</u>) by the end of October

each year confirming they are both aware of and adhering to the latest version of the JCQ regulations and signs and returns the head of centre's declaration which is then kept on file for inspection purposes

Head of centre declaration

The Head of Centre Declaration is displayed on the Exams Office Notice Board in the Exams Office. There is also a copy with the Examinations Officer.

- Enables the relevant senior leader(s), the examinations officer and the SENCo to receive appropriate training and support in order to facilitate the effective delivery of examinations and assessments within the centre and ensure compliance with the published JCQ regulations.
- Appoints a SENCo who will determine appropriate arrangements for candidates with learning difficulties and disabilities.
- Ensures centre staff undertake key tasks within the exams process and meet internal deadlines set by the EO.
- Makes sure that a teacher who teaches the subject being examined, or a senior member of teaching staff who has had overall responsibility for the subject department and/or preparing the candidates for the examination, is not an invigilator during the timetabled written examination or on-screen test.
- Ensures confidentiality and security within the examination process is compliant with and managed according to JCQ and awarding body regulations, guidance and instructions including:
 - the location of the centre's secure storage facility in a secure room solely assigned to examinations for the purpose of administering secure examination materials.
 - appropriate arrangements are in place to ensure that confidential materials are only delivered to authorised members of centre staff.
 - access to the secure room and secure storage facility is restricted to the authorised 2-4 keyholders.
 - the relevant awarding body is immediately informed if the security of question papers or confidential supporting instructions is put at risk.
 - that arrangements are in place to check that the correct question paper packets are opened by authorised members of centre staff.
- Through taking an ethical approach and working proactively to avoid malpractice among students and staff takes all reasonable steps to prevent the occurrence of any malpractice/maladministration before, during the course of and after examinations have taken place.
- Ensures irregularities are investigated and informs the awarding bodies of any cases of alleged, suspected or actual incidents of malpractice or maladministration, involving a candidate or a member of staff, are reported to the awarding body immediately.
- Ensures risks to the exam process are assessed and appropriate risk management processes/contingency plans are in place (that allow the senior leadership team to act immediately in the event of an emergency or staff absence)

- Ensures the relevant awarding bodies are informed of any Conflict of Interest
 - a member of centre staff is taking a qualification at the centre which includes internally assessed components/units (taking at the centre as a last resort where unable to find an alternative centre)
 - a candidate is being taught and prepared for a qualification which includes internally assessed components/units by a member of centre staff with a personal connection to the candidate.

- Maintains records that confirm the measures taken/protocols in place to mitigate any potential risk to the integrity of the qualifications affected by the above, and where
 - a member of exams office staff has a personal connection to a candidate being entered for exams and assessments at the centre or at another centre.
 - a member of centre staff is taking a qualification at the centre which does not include internally assessed components/units (taking at the centre as a last resort where unable to find an alternative centre)
 - a member of centre staff is taking a qualification at another centre.
- Ensures other relevant centre staff where they may be involved in the receipt and dispatch of confidential exam materials are briefed on the requirements for maintaining the integrity and confidentiality of the exam materials.
- Ensures members of centre staff do **not** forward e-mails and letters from awarding body or JCQ personnel without prior consent to third parties or upload such correspondence onto social media sites and applications.
- Ensures members of centre staff do **not** advise parents/candidates to contact awarding bodies/JCQ directly nor provide them with addresses/email addresses of awarding body examining/assessment or JCQ personnel.

Exams officer

- Understands the contents of annually updated JCQ publications including:
 - General Regulations for Approved Centres
 - Instructions for Conducting Examinations
 - <u>Suspected Malpractice in Examinations and Assessments</u>
 - <u>Post-results services</u> (PRS)
- Is familiar with the contents of annually updated information from awarding bodies on administrative procedures, key tasks, key dates and deadlines.
- Ensures key tasks are undertaken and key dates and deadlines met.
- Recruits, trains and deploys a team of internal/external invigilators; appoints lead invigilators, as required and keeps a record of the content of training provided to invigilators for the required period.
- Works with the SENCo to ensure invigilators supervising access arrangement candidates and those acting as a facilitator supporting access arrangement candidates fully understand the respective role and what is and what is not permissible in the exam room.
- Supports the head of centre in ensuring that awarding bodies are informed of any Conflict of Interest declared by members of centre staff and in maintaining records that confirm the measures taken/protocols in place to mitigate any potential risk to the integrity of the qualifications affected before the published deadline for entries.
- Briefs other relevant centre staff where they may be involved in the receipt and dispatch of confidential exam materials on the requirements for maintaining the integrity and confidentiality of the exam materials.

Senior leaders (SLT)

- Are familiar with the contents, refer to and direct relevant centre staff to annually updated JCQ publications including:
 - o <u>General Regulations for Approved Centres</u>
 - Instructions for Conducting Examinations
 - <u>Access Arrangements and Reasonable Adjustments</u>
 - Suspected Malpractice in Examinations and Assessments
 - Instructions for conducting non-examination assessments (and the instructions for conducting coursework)
 - <u>A guide to the special consideration process</u>

ALS Led/Special educational needs co-ordinator (SENCo)

- Understands the contents, refers to and directs relevant centre staff to annually updated JCQ publications including:
 - o <u>Access Arrangements and Reasonable Adjustments</u>
- Leads on the access arrangements and reasonable adjustments process (referred to in this policy as 'access arrangements')
- If not the qualified access arrangements assessor, works with the person appointed, on all matters relating to assessing candidates and ensures the correct procedures are followed.
- Presents when requested by a JCQ Centre Inspector, evidence of the assessor's qualification, which is held in the Learning Support Department and copies held of the Access Arrangement files.

Head of Department (HoD)

- Ensures teaching staff undertake key tasks, as detailed in this policy, within the exams process (exam cycle) and meet internal deadlines set by the EO and SENCo
- Ensures teaching staff keep themselves updated with awarding body subject and teacherspecific information to confirm effective delivery of qualifications.
- Ensures teaching staff attend relevant awarding body training and update events.

Teaching staff

- Undertake key tasks, as detailed in this policy, within the exams process and meet internal deadlines set by the EO and SENCo
- Keep updated with awarding body subject and teacher-specific information to confirm effective delivery of qualifications.
- Attend relevant awarding body training and update events.

Invigilators

- Attend/undertake training, update, briefing and review sessions as required.
- Provide information as requested on their availability to invigilate.
- Sign a confidentiality and security agreement and confirm whether they have any current maladministration/malpractice sanctions applied to them.

Reception staff

• Support the EO in the receipt and dispatch of confidential exam materials and follow the requirements for maintaining the integrity and confidentiality of the exam materials.

Site staff

- Support the EO in relevant matters relating to exam rooms and resources.
- Support the EO in the receipt of confidential exam material and follow the requirements for maintaining the integrity and confidentiality of the exam materials.

Candidates

Where applicable in this policy, the term 'candidates' refers to candidates and/or their parents/carers.

The exam cycles.

The exams management and administration process that needs to be undertaken for each **exam** series is often referred to as the **exam cycle** and relevant tasks required within this grouped into the following stages:

- planning
- entries
- pre-exams

Exams Pol/JW

- exam time
- results and post-results

This policy identifies roles and responsibilities of centre staff within this cycle.

Planning: roles and responsibilities

Information sharing

Head of centre

• Directs relevant centre staff to annually updated JCQ publications including <u>GR</u>, <u>ICE</u>, <u>AA</u>, <u>SMEA</u>, <u>NEA</u> (and the instructions for conducting coursework) and <u>SC</u>

Exams officer

- Signposts relevant centre staff to JCQ publications and awarding body documentation relating to the exams process that have been updated.
- Signposts relevant centre staff to JCQ information that should be provided to candidates.
- As the centre administrator, approves relevant access rights for centre staff to access awarding body secure extranet sites.

Information gathering

Exams officer

- Undertakes an annual information gathering exercise in preparation for each new academic year to ensure data about all qualifications being delivered is up to date and correct.
- Collates all information gathered into one central point of reference.
- Research awarding body guidance to identify administrative processes, key tasks, key dates and deadlines for all relevant qualifications.
- Produces an annual exams plan of key tasks and key dates to ensure all external deadlines can be effectively met; informs key centre staff of internal deadlines.
- Collects information on internal exams to enable preparation for and conduct of Pre-Public Exams.

Head of department

- Responds (or ensures teaching staff respond) to requests from the EO on information gathering.
- Meets the internal deadline for the return of information.
- Informs the EO of any changes to information in a timely manner minimising the risk of late or other penalty fees being incurred by an awarding body.
- Notes the internal deadlines in the annual exams plan and directs teaching staff to meet these.

Access arrangements

Head of centre

- Ensures there is appropriate accommodation for candidates requiring access arrangements in the centre for all examinations and assessments.
- Ensures a written process is in place to not only check the qualification(s) of the appointed assessor(s) but that the correct procedures are followed as of the JCQ publication <u>Access</u> <u>Arrangements and Reasonable Adjustments</u>. All copies of the relevant qualifications are kept in the Exams Office.
- Ensures the Exams Officer is fully supported in effectively implementing access arrangements and reasonable adjustments once approved.

Exams Officer

- Assesses candidates, as the Access Arrangements Coordinator (or works with the appropriately qualified assessor as appointed by the head of centre) to identify access arrangements requirements.
- Gathers **evidence** to support the need for access arrangements for a candidate.
- Liaises with teaching staff to gather evidence of **normal way of working** of an affected candidate.
- Determines candidate eligibility for arrangements or adjustments that are centre-delegated.
- Gathers signed **Personal data consent**, **Privacy Notice (AAO) and Data Protection confirmation** forms (candidate personal data consent form) from candidates where required.
- The EO will apply for **approval** through **Access arrangements online** (AAO) via the **Centre Admin Portal** (CAP), where required or through the awarding body where qualifications sit outside the scope of AAO
- Keeps a file for each candidate for JCQ inspection purposes containing all the required documentation (if any documentation is kept electronically, in the event of IT failure at the time of an inspection is able to access this documentation in an alternative format)
- Employs good practice in relation to the Equality Act 2010
- Liaises with the EO regarding exam time arrangements for access arrangement candidates.
- Ensures staff appointed to facilitate access arrangements for candidates are appropriately trained and understand the rules of the particular arrangement(s) and keeps a record of the content of training provided to facilitators for the required period.
- Works with the EO to ensure invigilators and those acting as a facilitator fully understand the respective role and what is and what is not permissible in the exam room.
- Provides and annually reviews a centre policy on the **use of word processors** in exams and assessments.

Word processor policy (exams)

The Word Processor Policy can be found on the Exams Office Notice Board, School Gateway and School Website

• Ensures criteria for candidates granted **separate invigilation within the centre** is clear, meets JCQ regulations and best meets the needs of individual candidates and remaining candidates in main exam rooms.

Separate invigilation within the centre policy

Candidates will be separately accommodated in their own exam room if:

- *it is the candidate's normal way of working in internal school tests and PPE exams; as a consequence of a long term medical condition or long term social, mental or emotional needs*
- the candidate requires a scribe, which necessitates speaking out aloud.

Senior Leaders, Head of department, Teaching staff

- Support the Exams Officer in determining and implementing appropriate access arrangements.
- Provide a statement for inspection purposes which details the criteria the centre uses to award and allocate word processors for examinations.

Internal assessment and endorsements

Head of centre

• Provides fully qualified teachers to mark non-examination assessments.

- Ensures an **internal appeals procedure** relating to internal assessment decisions is in place for a candidate to appeal against and request a review of the centre's marking (see Roles and responsibilities overview)
- Ensures a **non-examination assessment policy** is in place for GCE and GCSE qualifications which include components of non-examination assessment (For CCEA GCSE centres this would be a controlled assessment policy)

Non-examination assessment policy

The Non-Examination Assessment Policy can be found on the Exams Office Notice Board, School Gateway and School Website

• Ensures any irregularities relating to the production of work by candidates are investigated and dealt with internally if discovered prior to a candidate signing the authentication statement (where required) or reported to the awarding body if a candidate has signed the authentication statement

Senior leaders

- Ensure teaching staff have the necessary and appropriate knowledge, understanding, skills, and training to set tasks, conduct task taking, and to assess, mark and authenticate candidates' work (including where relevant, private candidates)
- Ensure appropriate internal moderation, standardisation and verification processes are in place.

Head of department

- Ensures teaching staff delivering any remaining legacy GCE unitised AS and A-level qualifications (which include elements of coursework), AQA Applied General qualifications, OCR Cambridge Nationals, Entry Level Certificate or Project qualifications follow JCQ Instructions for conducting coursework and the specification provided by the awarding body
- Ensures teaching staff delivering GCE & GCSE specifications (which include components of non-examination assessment) follow JCQ <u>Instructions for conducting non-examination assessments</u> and the specification provided by the awarding body
- For other qualifications, ensures teaching staff follow appropriate instructions issued by the awarding body.
- Ensures teaching staff inform candidates of their centre assessed marks as a candidate may request a review of the centre's marking before marks are submitted to the awarding body.

Teaching staff

- Ensure appropriate instructions for conducting internal assessment are followed.
- Ensure candidates are aware of JCQ and awarding body information for candidates on producing work that is internally assessed (coursework, non-examination assessments, social media) prior to assessments taking place.
- Ensure candidates are informed of their centre assessed marks as a candidate may request a review of the centre's marking before marks are submitted to the awarding body.

Exams officer

- Identifies relevant key dates and administrative processes that need to be followed in relation to internal assessment.
- Signposts teaching staff to relevant JCQ *information for candidates* documents that are annually updated

Invigilation

Head of centre

- Ensures relevant support is provided to the EO in recruiting, training and deploying a team of invigilators.
- Ensures, if contracting supply staff to act as invigilators, that such persons are competent and fully trained, understanding what is and what is not permissible (and not taking on its own an assurance from a recruitment agency, that this is the case)
- Determines if additional invigilators will be deployed in timed Art exams in addition to the subject teacher to ensure the supervision of candidates is maintained at all times.

Exams officer

- Recruits additional invigilators where required to effectively cover all exam periods/series' throughout the academic year
- Collects information on new recruits to identify if they have invigilated previously and if any current maladministration/malpractice sanctions are applied to them.
- Provides training for new invigilators on the instructions for conducting exams and an annual update training for the existing invigilation team so that they are aware of any changes in a new academic year before they are allocated to invigilate an exam.
- Ensures invigilators supervising access arrangement candidates understand their role (and the role of a facilitator who may be supporting a candidate) and the rules and regulations of the access arrangement(s)
- Ensures invigilators are briefed on the access arrangement candidates in their exam room (and that these candidates are identified on the seating plan) and confirms invigilators understand what is and what is not permissible.
- Collects evaluation of training to inform future events.

Entries: roles and responsibilities

Estimated entries.

Exams officer

 Requests estimated or early entry information, where this may be required by awarding bodies, from HoDs in a timely manner to ensure awarding body external deadlines for submission can be met.

Estimated entries collection and submission procedure.

The Examinations Officer to check all data/courses/entries that come in and submit all required information to awarding body via secure websites before issued deadlines.

• Makes candidates aware of the JCQ Information for candidates – Privacy Notice at the start of a vocational qualification or when entries are being processed for a general qualification.

Head of department

- Provides entry information requested by the EO to the internal deadline.
- Informs the EO immediately of any subsequent changes to entry information.

Final entries

Exams officer

• Requests final entry information from HoDs in a timely manner to ensure awarding body external deadlines for submission can be met.

- Informs HoDs of subsequent deadlines for making changes to final entry information without charge.
- Confirms with HoDs final entry information that has been submitted to awarding bodies.
- Ensures as far as possible that entry processes minimise the risk of entries or registrations being missed reducing the potential for late or other penalty fees being charged by awarding bodies.

Final entries collection and submission procedure

- EO to import awarding body Basedata and create Bromcom EDI marksheets based on subjects estimated entries information and hand to HOD's at least 3 to 4 weeks before external deadline.
- *HOD's liaise with teachers to denote final entries on applicable marksheets by internal deadline checking candidate name, tier, specification title/code, certification codes, coursework/examination units etc.*
- EO to check all marksheets against specifications/awarding body criteria to make sure all applicable certification, examination and coursework codes have been supplied in order to certificate a full award. EO then to manually input entry information that is received, onto created Bromcom EDI marksheets.
- EO to print off completed mark/exam sheets before submission and send them out of HOD's to check and sign off if correct.
- On receipt of signature/confirmation from HOD's EO will make any applicable changes and then EO will submit all entries to the applicable awarding bodies before the external deadline via the A2C provider/Bromcom.

Head of department

- Provides information requested by the EO to the internal deadline.
- Informs the EO immediately, or at the very least prior to the deadlines, of any subsequent changes to final entry information, which includes:
 - changes to candidate personal details
 - o amendments to existing entries
 - withdrawals of existing entries
- Checks final entry submission information provided by the EO and confirms information is correct.

Entry fees

- The centre will pay all normal examination fees on behalf of candidates. Late or amended entry fees may be charged to the subject areas concerned.
- Candidates or subject areas will not normally be charged for a change of tier, withdrawals made by the proper procedures, or alterations arising from administrative processes provided these are made within the time allowed by the awarding bodies,.
- Woolwich Polytechnic School for Boys will invoice parents/carers if a student misses an examination with no reason or fails to complete the required coursework rendering the examination void after the entry has been made. If a candidate is missing at the start of an examination Woolwich Polytechnic School for Boys will make every attempt to contact the candidate by telephone/email.
- Late entry or amendment fees are paid by the department.
- The EO will manage the examination budget and check how entry fees are collected/recharged including late, amendment or re-sit fees where this may be applicable in the centre.

• EO to sign off all invoices and correct fees charged against awarding body documentation and the Bromcom examination module that calculates the exact examination cost based on entry submission

Late entries

Exams officer

- Has clear entry procedures in place to minimise the risk of late entries.
- Charges any late or other penalty fees to departmental budgets.

Head of department

- Minimises the risk of late entries by
 - o following procedures identified by the EO in relation to making final entries on time
 - meeting internal deadlines identified by the EO for making final entries.

<u>Re-sit entries</u>

Candidates are allowed 1 retake per subject or module in GCSE Candidates are allowed 1 retake per module or subject in AS Candidates are allowed 1 retake per module or subject in A Level

Candidate statements of entry

Exams officer

• Provides candidates with statements of entry for checking.

Teaching staff

• Ensure candidates check statements of entry and return any relevant confirmation required to the EO

Candidates

• Confirm entry information is correct or notify the EO of any discrepancies.

Pre-exams: roles and responsibilities

Access arrangements

ALS Lead/SENCo

- Ensures appropriate arrangements, adjustments and adaptations are in place to facilitate access to exams/assessments for candidates where they are disabled within the meaning of the Equality Act (unless a temporary emergency arrangement is required at the time of an exam)
- Ensures a candidate is involved in any decisions about arrangements, adjustments and /or adaptations that may be put in place for him/her.
- Ensures exam information (JCQ information for candidates' information, individual exam timetable etc.) is adapted where this may be required for a disabled candidate to access it
- Allocates appropriately trained centre staff to facilitate access arrangements for candidates in exams and assessments (ensuring that the facilitator appointed meets JCQ requirements and fully understands the rule of the particular access arrangement)
- Where relevant, ensures the necessary and appropriate steps are undertaken to gather an appropriate picture of need and demonstrate normal way of working for a private candidate

(including distance learners and home educated candidates) and that the candidate is assessed by the centre's appointed assessor.

Briefing candidates

Exams officer

- Issues individual exam timetable information to candidates and informs candidates of any contingency day awarding bodies may identify in the event of national or local disruption to exams.
- Prior to exams issues relevant JCQ information for candidate's documents
- Where relevant, issues relevant awarding body information to candidates
- Issues centre exam information to candidates including information on:
 - exam timetable clashes
 - o arriving late for an exam
 - o absence or illness during exams
 - o what equipment is/is not provided by the centre
 - o food and drink in exam rooms
 - wrist watches in exam rooms
 - when and how results will be issued and the staff that will be available.
 - o the post-results services and how the centre deals with requests from candidates
 - when and how certificates will be issued.

Access to scripts, reviews of results and appeals procedures.

•	Enquires about results may be requested by centre staff or candidates if there are reasonable grounds for believing there has been an error in marking.
•	If a result is queried, the Examinations Officer, teaching staff and Head of Centre will investigate the feasibility of asking for a review at the centre's expense.
•	When the centre does not uphold an EAR, a candidate may apply to have an enquiry carried out. If a candidate requires this against the advice of subject staff, they will be charged.
•	JCQ consent form to be read and signed by candidate.
•	After the release of results, candidates may ask subject staff to request the return of papers within five days' scrutiny of the results.
•	Centre staff may also request scripts for investigation or for teaching purposes. For the latter, the consent of candidates must be obtained.
•	GCSE reviews cannot be applied for once a script has been returned.
•	Contact should be made to the EO if a candidate or indeed centre staff disagree with an outcome of an enquiry about a result. Further details will be obtained from the awarding body including the applicable fees. Please refer to the separate internal appeals policy available on Website, Learning Gateway or with the Examination Officer.

Dispatch of exam scripts

Exams officer

• Identifies and confirms arrangements for the dispatch of candidate exam scripts with the DfE (STA) 'yellow label service' or the awarding body where qualifications sit outside the scope of the service.

Estimated grades.

Head of department

• Ensures teaching staff provide estimated grade information to the EO by the internal deadline (where this still may be required by the awarding body)

Exams officer

- Submits estimated grade information to awarding bodies to meet the external deadline (where this may still be required by the awarding body)
- Keeps a record to track what has been sent.

Internal assessment and endorsements

Head of centre

• Ensures procedures are in place for candidates to appeal internal assessment decisions and make requests for reviews of marking.

SENCo

• Liaises with teaching staff to implement appropriate access arrangements for candidates undertaking internal assessments and practical endorsements.

Teaching staff

- Support the SENCo in implementing appropriate access arrangements for candidates undertaking internal assessments and practical endorsements.
- Assess and authenticate candidates' work.
- Assess endorsed components.
- Ensure candidates are informed of centre assessed marks prior to marks being submitted to awarding bodies.

Head of department

- Ensures teaching staff assess and authenticate candidates' work to the awarding body requirements.
- Ensures teaching staff assess endorsed components according to awarding body requirements.
- Ensures teaching staff provide marks for internally assessed components and grades for endorsements of qualifications to the EO to the internal deadline.
- Ensures teaching staff provide required samples of work for moderation and sample recordings for monitoring to the EO to the internal deadline.

Exams officer

- Submits marks, endorsement grades and samples to awarding bodies/moderators/monitors to meet the external deadline.
- Keeps a record to track what has been sent.
- Logs moderated samples returned to the centre.
- Ensures teaching staff are aware of the requirements in terms of retention and subsequent disposal of candidates' work.

Candidates

• Authenticate their work as required by the awarding body.

Invigilation

Exams officer

• Provides an annually reviewed/updated invigilator handbook to invigilators, trains new invigilators on appointment and updates experienced invigilators annually.

Exams Pol/JW

- Deploys invigilators effectively to exam rooms throughout an exam series (including the
 provision of a roving invigilator where a candidate and invigilator [acting as a practical
 assistant, reader or scribe] are accommodated on a 1:1 basis to enter the room at regular
 intervals in order to observe the conducting of the exam, ensuring all relevant rules are being
 adhered to and supporting the practical assistant/reader and/or scribe in maintaining the
 integrity of the exam)
- Allocates invigilators to exam rooms (or where supervising candidates due to a timetable clash) according to the required ratios.
- Liaises with the SENCo regarding the facilitation and invigilation of access arrangement candidates.

SENCo

• Liaises with the EO regarding facilitation and invigilation of access arrangement candidates.

Invigilators

• Provide information as requested on their availability to invigilate throughout an exam series.

JCQ Centre Inspections

Exams officer or Senior leader

• Will accompany the Inspector throughout a visit.

SENCo or relevant Senior leader (in the absence of the SENCo)

- Will meet with the inspector when requested to provide documentary evidence regarding access arrangement candidates and address any questions the inspector may raise.
- Ensures that information is readily available for inspection at the venue where the candidate is taking the exam(s)

<u>Seating and identifying candidates in exam rooms.</u>

Exams officer

• Ensures a procedure is in place to verify candidate identity including private candidates.(which are only accepted at the discretion of the EO)

Verifying candidate identity procedure

To verify a candidate's identity – personalised ID cards will be present on each exam desk or on each student for each exam as per the examination seating plan. These are individually created for each student and all details are imported from our schools information management system (Bromcom). Candidates will also wear a personalised photographic ID badge on their person for identification to exams staff. Candidates are also identified during the warmup sessions and a register is completed

Students that have access arrangements in place are identified by a different coloured seat ticket.

- Ensures invigilators are aware of the procedure.
- Provides seating plans for exam rooms according to JCQ and awarding body requirements (and ensures candidates with access arrangements are identified on the seating plan)

Invigilators

- Follow the procedure for verifying candidate identity provided by the EO
- Seat candidates in exam rooms as instructed by the EO/on the seating plan

Security of exam materials

Exams officer

- Confirms appropriate arrangements are in place to ensure that confidential materials are only delivered to those authorised by the head of centre.
- Has a process in place to demonstrate the receipt, secure movement and secure storage of confidential exam materials within the centre
- Ensures a log is kept at the initial point of delivery recording confidential materials received and signed for by authorised staff within the centre and that appropriate arrangements are in place for confidential materials to be immediately transferred to the secure storage facility until they can be removed from the dispatch packaging and checked in the secure room before being returned to the secure storage facility in timetable order.
- Ensures the secure storage facility contains only current and live confidential material.
- Ensures that examination stationery, e.g., answer booklets and formula booklets, clean texts are stored in the secure

Reception staff

• Follow the process to log confidential materials delivered to/received by the centre to the point materials are issued to authorised staff for transferal to the secure storage facility.

Teaching staff

• Adhere to the process to record the secure movement of confidential materials taken from or returned to secure storage throughout the time the material is confidential.

Timetabling and rooming

Exams officer

- Produces a master centre exam timetable for each exam series.
- Identifies and resolves candidate exam timetable clashes according to the regulations (only applying overnight supervision arrangements as a last resort, once all other options have been exhausted and according to the centre's policy)
- Identifies exam rooms and specialist equipment requirements.
- Allocates invigilators to exam rooms (or where supervising candidates due to an exam timetable clash) according to required ratios.
- Liaises with site staff to ensure exam rooms are set up according to JCQ and awarding body requirements.
- Liaises with the SENCo regarding rooming of access arrangement candidates.

SENCo

- Liaises with the EO regarding rooming of access arrangement candidates.
- Liaises with other relevant centre staff to ensure appropriate arrangements, adjustments and adaptations are in place to facilitate access for disabled candidates to exams.

Site staff

• Liaise with the EO to ensure exam rooms are set up according to JCQ and awarding body requirements.

Alternative site arrangements

Exams officer

• Ensures question papers will only be taken to an alternative site where the published criteria for an alternative site arrangement have been met.

• Will inform the JCQ Centre Inspection Service to timescale by submitting a JCQ Alternative Site arrangement notification through CAP (or through the awarding body where a qualification may sit outside the scope of CAP) of any alternative sites that will be used to conduct timetabled examination components of the qualifications listed in the JCQ regulations.

Transferred candidate arrangements.

Exams officer

- Liaises with the host or entering centre, as required.
- Processes requests for *Transferred Candidate arrangements* through CAP to the awarding body deadline (or through the awarding body where a qualification may sit outside the scope of CAP)
- Where relevant (for an internal candidate) informs the candidate of the arrangements that have been made for their transferred candidate arrangements

<u>Internal exams</u>

Exams officer

- Prepares for the conduct of internal exams under external conditions.
- Provides a centre exam timetable of subjects and rooms.
- Provides seating plans for exam rooms.
- Requests internal exam papers from teaching staff
- Arranges invigilation.

SENCo

• Liaises with teaching staff to make appropriate arrangements for access arrangement candidates.

Teaching staff

- Provide exam papers and materials to the EO.
- Support the SENCo in making appropriate arrangements for access arrangement candidates.

Exam time: roles and responsibilities

Access arrangements

Exams officer

- Provides cover sheets for access arrangement candidates' scripts where required for particular arrangements.
- Has a process in place to deal with emergency access arrangements as they arise at the time of exams
 - applies for approval through AAO where required or through the awarding body where qualifications sit outside the scope of AAO

Candidate absence

Candidate absence policy

Should a candidate be too ill to sit an exam, suffer bereavement or other trauma or be taken ill during the exam itself, it is the candidate's responsibility to alert the centre, Examination Officer, to that effect.

Any special consideration claim must be supported by appropriate evidence within five days of the exam, for example a letter/medical certificate from the candidate's doctor.

The Examination Officer will then forward a completed special consideration form to the relevant awarding body within seven days of the exam.

The outcome on a special consideration application is the decision made by awarding body.

Invigilators

- Are informed of the policy/process for dealing with absent candidates through training.
- Ensure that confirmed absent candidates are clearly marked as such on the attendance register and seating plan.

Candidates

• Are re-charged relevant entry fees for unauthorised absence from exams.

Candidate behaviour

See Irregularities below.

Candidate belongings

See Unauthorised materials below.

Candidate late arrival

Exams officer

- Ensures that candidates who arrive very late for an exam are reported to the awarding body by submitting a *report on candidate admitted very late to examination room* through CAP to timescale.
- Warns candidates that their script may not be accepted by the awarding body

Invigilators

- Are informed of the policy/process for dealing with late/very late arrival candidates through training
- Ensure that relevant information is recorded on the exam room incident log

Candidate late arrival policy

All late arrivals must report to reception where they are met by the Examinations Officer and a member of SLT.

The Examinations Officer to accompany the candidate to the exam room and ensures that the invigilator makes a full note of the circumstances on the exam room incident log. Candidates who arrive persistently late will be dealt with by the Head of Year/member of SLT. Very late arrivals will be dealt with in the same manner but advised that the

awarding body may not accept their script.

The Examinations Officer to complete form JCQ/VLA-Report on candidate.

admitted very late to an examination.

Conducting exams

Head of centre

• Ensures venues used for conducting exams meet the requirements of JCQ and awarding bodies.

Exams officer

- Ensures exams are conducted according to JCQ and awarding body instructions.
- Uses an *exam day checklist* to ensure each exam session is fully prepared for, unplanned events can be dealt with and associated follow-up is completed

Dispatch of exam scripts

Exams officer

- Dispatches scripts as instructed by JCQ and awarding bodies.
- Keeps appropriate records to track dispatch.

Exam papers and materials

Exams officer

- Organises exam question papers and associated confidential resources in date order in the secure storage facility.
- Attaches erratum notices received to relevant exam question paper packets.
- Collates attendance registers and examiner details in date order.
- Regularly checks mail or email inbox for updates from awarding bodies.
- In order to avoid potential breaches of security, ensures prior to question paper packets being opened that another member of staff or an invigilator checks the day, date, time, subject, unit/component and tier of entry if appropriate, immediately before a question paper packet is opened.
- Ensures this additional/second check (which takes place in the secure room if a question paper packet has to be split or in the designated exam room if not) is recorded.
- Where allowed by the awarding body, only releases exam papers and materials to teaching departments for teaching and learning purposes after the published finishing time of the exam, or until any timetable clash candidates have completed the exam

<u>Exam rooms</u>

Head of centre

- Ensures that internal tests, mock exams, revision or coaching sessions are not conducted in a room 'designated' as an exam room.
- Ensures that when a room is 'designated' as an exam room it is not used for any purpose other than conducting external exams.
- Ensures only authorised centre staff are present in exam rooms.
- Ensures the centre's policy relating to food and drink that may be allowed in exam rooms is clearly communicated to candidates.
- Ensures the centre's policy on candidates leaving the exam room temporarily is clearly communicated to candidates.

Food and drink in exam rooms policy

A bottle of water may be allowed in the examination room at the discretion of the Examination Officer. However, this is on the condition that any water brought into the examination room by the candidate is free from packaging and all labels are removed from drink containers. The centre stipulates that the drink must be water only.

Food is not allowed in the examination room unless on medical grounds and agreed with the *Examinations Officer*.

Exams officer

- Ensures exam rooms are set up and conducted as required in the regulations.
- Provides invigilators with appropriate resources to effectively conduct exams.
- Briefs invigilators on exams to be conducted on a session-by-session basis (including the arrangements in place for any transferred candidates and access arrangement candidates)

- Ensures sole invigilators have an appropriate means of summoning assistance (if this is a mobile phone, instructs the invigilator that this must be on silent mode)
- Ensures invigilators understand they must be vigilant and remain aware of incidents or emerging situations, looking out for malpractice or candidates who may be in distress, recording any incidents or issues on the exam room incident log
- Ensures invigilators understand how to deal with candidates who may need to leave the exam room temporarily and how this should be recorded on the exam room incident log.
- Provides authorised exam materials which candidates are not expected to provide themselves.
- Ensures invigilators and candidates are aware of the emergency evacuation procedure.
- Ensures invigilators are aware of arrangements in place for a candidate with a disability who may need assistance if an exam room is evacuated.

Senior leaders

- Ensure a documented emergency evacuation procedure for exam rooms is in place.
- Ensure arrangements are in place for a candidate with a disability who may need assistance if an exam room is evacuated.

Emergency evacuation policy

The Emergency Evacuation Policy can be found on the Exams Office Notice Board, School Gateway and School Website

Site staff

- Ensure exam rooms are available and set up as requested by the EO.
- Ensure grounds or centre maintenance work does not disturb exam candidates in exam rooms.
- Ensure fire alarm testing does not take place during exam sessions.

Invigilators

 Conduct exams in every exam room according to JCQ Instructions for conducting examinations and/or awarding body requirements and as instructed by the centre in training/update and briefing sessions.

Candidates

- Are required to follow the instructions given to them in exam rooms by authorised centre staff and invigilators.
- Are required to remain in the exam room for the full duration of the exam.

Irregularities

Head of centre

• Ensures any cases of alleged, suspected or actual incidents of malpractice or maladministration before, during or after examinations/assessments (by centre staff, candidates, invigilators) are investigated and reported to the awarding body **immediately**, by completing the appropriate documentation.

Managing behaviour in exam rooms procedure

If there, any problems with behaviour in any of the exam rooms, the Examinations Officer will attend and call a member of the SLT to the room and deal with the situation as appropriate.

Senior leaders

- Ensure support is provided for the EO and invigilators when dealing with disruptive candidates in exam rooms.
- Ensure that internal disciplinary procedures relating to candidate behaviour are instigated, when appropriate

Exams officer

- Provides an exam room incident log in all exam rooms for recording any incidents or irregularities.
- Actions any required follow-up and reports to awarding bodies as soon as practically possible after the exam has taken place.

Invigilators

 Record any incidents or irregularities on the exam room incident log (for example, late/very late arrival, candidate or centre staff suspected malpractice, candidate illness or needing to leave the exam room temporarily, disruption or disturbance in the exam room, emergency evacuation)

Malpractice

See Irregularities above.

Special consideration

Exams officer

- Processes appropriate requests for special consideration to awarding bodies.
- Gathers evidence which may need to be provided by other staff in centre or candidates.
- Submits requests to awarding bodies to the external deadline.

Special consideration policy

The Special Consideration Policy can be found on the Exams Office Notice Board, School Gateway and School Website

Candidates

• Provide appropriate evidence to support special consideration requests, where required.

Unauthorised materials

Arrangements for unauthorised materials taken into the exam room.

The centre's published rules on acceptable dress and behaviour apply at all times.

- Candidates' personal belongings remain their own responsibility and the centre accepts no liability for their loss or damage.
- All candidate belongings are to be left in a designated room (Lecture Theatre) depending on what venue is been used for that examination season. If classrooms are being used, then on the instruction of the invigilator.
- All Phones, Smartwatches, Wrist watches, IPod, MP3 players, headphones or any electronic web/enabled devices are not to be brought into the examination room.

Invigilators

Are informed of the arrangements through training.

Internal exams

Exams officer

• Briefs invigilators on conducting internal exams.

Exams Pol/JW

• Returns candidate scripts to teaching staff for marking.

Invigilators

• Conduct internal exams as briefed by the EO.

Results and post-results: roles and responsibilities

Internal assessment

Head of department

- Ensures teaching staff keep candidates' work, whether part of the moderation sample or not, secure and for the required period stated by JCQ and awarding bodies.
- Ensures work is returned to candidates or disposed of according to the requirements.

Managing results day(s)

Senior leaders

- Identify centre staff who will be involved in the main summer results day(s) and their role.
- Ensures senior members of staff are accessible to candidates after the publication of results so that results may be discussed, and decisions made on the submission of any requests for post-results services and ensures candidates are informed of the periods during which centre staff will be available so that they may plan accordingly

Exams officer

• Works with senior leaders to ensure procedures for managing the main summer results day(s) (a results day programme) are in place.

Results day programme

Candidates will receive individual results slips on results days in person at the centre / by post to their home addresses (candidates to provide sae). If a student is unable to collect their results in person, permission must be given by the student (to the Examinations Officer) to allow another person to collect on their behalf.

(Prior to the Examination series, students are given a booklet explaining the procedure on how results are released on results day and post results service) Arrangements for the school to be open on results days are made by the head of centre. The provision of staff on results days is the responsibility of the head of centre.

Site staff

• Ensure the centre is open and accessible to centre staff and candidates, as required for the collection of results.

Accessing results

Head of centre

• Ensures results are kept entirely confidential and restricted to key members of staff until the official dates and times of release of results to candidates.

Exams officer

- Informs candidates in advance of when and how results will be released to them for each exam series.
- Accesses results from awarding bodies under restricted release of results, where this is provided by the awarding body.

- Resolves any missing or incomplete results with awarding bodies.
- Issues statements of results to candidates on issue of results date
- Provides summaries of results for relevant centre staff on issue of results date

Post-results services

Head of centre

- Ensures an **internal appeals procedure** is available where candidates disagree with any centre decision not to support a clerical re-check, a review of marking, a review of moderation or an appeal.
- Understands that if the centre has concerns about one of its component/subject cohorts, then requests for reviews of marking should be submitted for all candidates believed to be affected (candidate consent is required as marks and subject grades may be lowered, confirmed or raised)

Exams officer

- Provides information to candidates (including private candidates) and staff on the services provided by awarding bodies and the fees charged (see also above *Briefing candidates* and *Access to scripts, enquiries about results and appeals procedures*)
- Publishes internal deadlines for requesting the services to ensure the external deadlines can be effectively met.
- Provides a process to record requests for services and to collect candidate informed consent (after the publication of results) and fees where relevant.
- Submits requests to awarding bodies to meet the external deadline for the particular service.
- Tracks requests to conclusion and informs candidates and relevant centre staff of outcomes.
- Updates centre results information, where applicable

Teaching staff

- Meet internal deadlines to request the services and gain relevant candidate informed consent.
- Identify the budget to which fees should be charged.

Candidates

- Meet internal deadlines to request the services.
- Provide informed consent and fees, where relevant

Analysis of results

Data Manager

- Provides analysis of results to appropriate centre staff
- Provides results information to external organisations where required.
- Undertakes the secondary school and college (key stage 4/16-18) performance tables *June* and September checking exercise.

Certificates

Certificates are provided to centres by awarding bodies after results have been confirmed.

Issue of certificates procedure

- *Certificates are made available from the end of November.*
- Students are informed when certificates are ready for collect by announcing on the Website, Student Gateway and notification by the Examinations Officer.

- Certificates may be collected by the candidate in person or by a third party on behalf of the candidate, provided they have been authorised to do so and a letter of consent from the candidate and a form of ID is presented.
- The centre is retaining the certificates for two years.

Candidates

• May arrange for certificates to be collected on their behalf by providing the EO with written or email permission/authorisation; authorised persons must provide ID evidence on collection of certificates.

Retention of certificates policy

Uncollected certificates are stored in the exams office with the corresponding register. Certificates may be destroyed if not collected after two calendar years.

Exams review: roles and responsibilities

Exams officer

- Provides SLT with an overview of the exam year, highlighting what went well and what could be developed/improved in terms of exams management and administrative processes within the stages of the exam cycle.
- Collects and evaluates feedback from staff, candidates and invigilators to inform an exams review

Senior leaders

• Work with the EO to produce a plan to action any required improvements identified in the review.

Retention of records: roles and responsibilities

Exams officer

- Keeps records as required by JCQ and awarding bodies for the required period.
- Keeps records as required by the centre's records management policy.
- Provides an exams archiving policy that identifies information held, retention period and method of disposal

Exams archiving policy.
